40 Oaks to celebrate 40 years

2011 marks the 40th anniversary of the creation of Chichester Harbour Conservancy. The Conservancy was formed in 1971 by Act of Parliament, not only to act as the Harbour Authority, but to conserve and enhance the area of land within Chichester Harbour Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). Part of our legacy has been to plant tens of thousands of young trees to create new woodlands and hedgerows.

To celebrate our 40th birthday we plan to plant 40 young Oak trees in 2011, and **we need your help.**

We are asking the community, through parish councils, schools and landowners to plant a tree in the AONB that will provide a lasting legacy in our precious landscape.

We have chosen Oak trees as they are an iconic part of the Harbour landscape.

If you would like to join us in planting an Oak tree, please read the information opposite, and then complete and return the tear off strip overleaf.



About the Scheme

- The Conservancy will provide you with a young Oak tree in a pot. The tree will be 175-200cm in height. We will also supply a tree stake and tie.

- The tree can be planted in an open space as a landscape tree; in a hedge as a hedge tree; or along the shoreline

to replace any coastal Oaks lost to erosion.

- We ask that you plant the tree and look after it. It may need watering during the summer until it is old enough to look after itself.
- We need you to tell us where you are planting it; ideally it should be somewhere it can be seen and enjoyed by lots of people. (Unless you are a private landowner, in which case we just ask for a location map.)
- The trees need to be tagged with a temporary identifying marker. These will be provided by the Conservancy and will fall off as the tree grows.
- In planting a tree you agree to any publicity and promotion of the scheme by the Conservancy (for example we might want to use a photo of you planting the tree for a press release).
- You may apply for more than one tree.
