A shoreline walk on Hayling Island passing alongside Sandy Point Nature Reserve, the Hayling RNLI Station and with splendid views to the entrance of Chichester Harbour and the wider Solent. The RNLI teams are usually out practising on Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings.

The Hayling RNLI station started on the sea front in 1865 but was established on its present site in 1975. The impressive building you can see was built in 2007. The latest lifeboats are a B Class called the 'Derrick Battle' and a D Class called 'The Amanda, James and Ben'.
