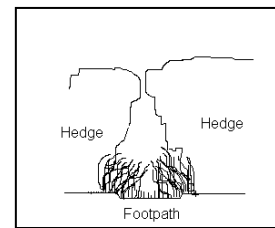

1. Footpaths

Structures. As you walk your section please check the condition of stiles, kissing gates and bridges and report any problems such as vandalism, wobbly handrails, broken latches on gates etc.

Footpath surface. Please rate the condition of the footpath surface on a scale of 1 to 4 (1 being very good, 4 being very bad). Look out for things such as protruding objects or large pot-holes/rabbit holes that could pose a danger to people using the path.

Vegetation. During the Spring and Summer months many of the footpaths around the harbour can get overgrown with vegetation.
